

Translating Text From Online Textbooks

Google Translate Extension

- On your Chromebook: Go to Google Web Store.
Search: **Google Translate**. Select the one that has the “**G**”.
Select **Add to Chrome**.



OR

- Go to <https://chrome.google.com/webstore/search/google%20translate>
- Scroll down and click on Google translate extension, click on **Add to Chrome**.
- Now you should see a blue icon with the **white letter G** in the upper right corner.

Online Textbook

- Create a **NEW** folder for the textbook in **My Drive**.
(1. Social Studies Textbook, 2. Science Textbook).
- Create a **NEW Google Doc** inside the folder for that textbook. (Title: Chapter **1**, Lesson **1**)



- Open the online textbook, highlight the text you want to have translated.
- Copy text and paste into the Google Doc.

Control + C = copy
Control + V = paste
(Ctrl = control)

- Click on the blue icon in right corner and click on **Translate This Page**. (It can also translate a single word if you type it in the box. It can even read it to you.)
- A mini window will appear, on the left-hand side click the language you would like and it will automatically translate for you.
